St. David's has sent a contribution toward the above items. In addition, we are gathering a few hiking guide items as a more personalized gift from us.


Looking forward a bit more, we are planning a book study/discussion for October. We will be reading *Church of the Wild* by Victoria Loorz.

St. David's provides the all of the utilities and facilities out of which the Circle of Page operates the "Healthy Meals" Soup Kitchen, the "Come to the Banquet" food pantry, and the Financial Help desk, as well as the Salvation Army financial assistance program.

While food distribution happens at specific hours each week, volunteers are also needed at many different times during the week: to pick up food from Safeway and Wal-Mart; to prepare for distributions; for cooking and distribution at the Soup Kitchen. Volunteers provide in excess of 450 hours of service each month.
