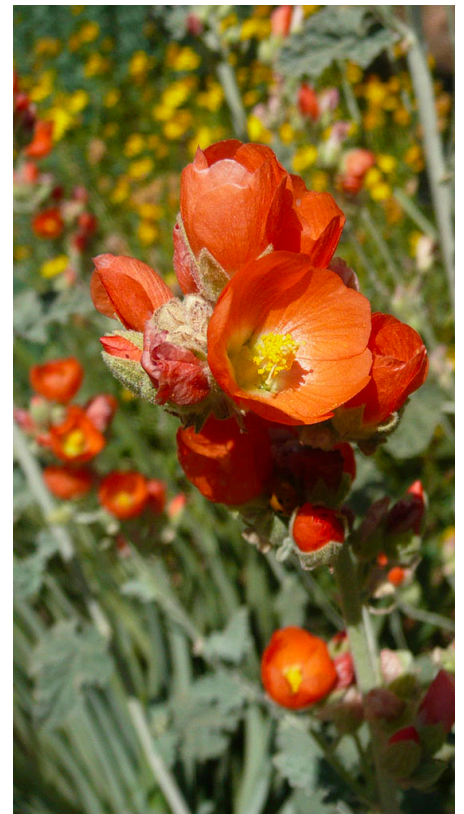


## The View from St. David's

## Flushing Our Future

It is estimated that 270,000 trees are cut down each DAY to provide wood for the production of toilet paper.










Toilet paper is a single use product that may not create the piles of trash that plastic does, but it certainly destroys the forests of the world. Check out reports on toilet paper at this link:

The Natural Resources Defense Council has published extensively on the topic. These figures are found on pages 10 and 11 of *"The Issue with Tissue: How Americans Are Flushing Forests Down the Toilet."*

Here is one example of an alternative to tree-based paper made from sustainable bamboo!
