

The Arctic Refuge on the coastal plain of Alaska is a remote and unspoiled natural area. It's teeming with wildlife, from migratory birds that fly to all 50 states to thousands of caribou to polar bears. It's also a sacred place to the Gwich'in people.

Together with supporters like you, Environment America has been defending the Arctic Refuge for decades. The refuge has long been a target for oil and gas drilling. Raising the voices of citizens from every corner of our country, they've demonstrated that drilling would spoil this special place.

And now, two more companies are hearing our message loud and clear.

Chubb Insurance recently committed to not insuring fossil fuel projects in the Arctic Refuge. You can't drill for oil without insurance, which is why they've called on major insurance companies to step away from any new fossil fuel development in the Arctic.

Environment America and partners delivered 70,000 petitions to Chubb headquarters in New York City, and now Chubb has agreed not to underwrite oil and gas projects in the Arctic Refuge. That puts us one step closer to protecting the Arctic from oil and gas drilling.

Oil companies are also stepping away from drilling in the Arctic. **This month, ExxonMobil announced to shareholders that it has no plans for new oil and gas development in the Arctic Refuge.**
